Lunar New Year Animal Exploration

Use this guide to learn about Lunar New Year 2025: The Year of the Snake and to locate works of art in the galleries.

The Lunar New Year occurs each year between January 21 and February 19. In 2025, the first day of Lunar New Year is celebrated on January 29 with festivities continuing until the Lantern Festival, which celebrates the first full moon of the New Year on February 12. Unless noted, the animals in this list are on view in the Chinese galleries.

The snake, horse, ram, monkey, rooster, dog, pig/boar, rat, ox, tiger, rabbit, and dragon form a 12-year cycle. According to a Chinese legend, the twelve animals quarreled about who was to head the cycle of years. It was decided that a contest would be held to determine the sequence of years. The first animal to reach the other side of the riverbank would have the first year of the lunar calendar named after them, and the rest of the animals would receive their years according to their finish. All twelve animals gathered at the riverbank and jumped in. Unknown to the ox, the rat had jumped upon his back. As the ox was about to step ashore, the rat sprung from the ox's back and won the race. The languid pig was last. Therefore, the rat is the first year of the animal cycle, the ox is second, and the pig is last.

Snake (1929 - 1941 - 1953 - 1965 - 1977 - 1989 - 2001 - 2013 - 2025)

Ram (1931 - 1943 - 1955 - 1967 - 1979 - 1991 - 2003 - 2015 - 2027)

Except for the knack of always getting off on the wrong foot with people, being the first to complain, pessimistic, and dependent on material comforts, rams can be charming, elegant, and creative. Rams are best suited to artistic, musical, medical, editorial, and educational endeavors. Rooster (1933 - 1945 - 1957 - 1969 - 1981 - 1993 - 2005 - 2017 - 2029)

Roosters are flashy, extravagant, hardworking, shrewd, decisive, and opinionated dreamers. Professions suited to roosters include political, diplomatic, literary, and artistic. Some roosters: Buddha, Ptolemy, Benjamin Franklin, St. Patrick, Meghan Markle, Amelia Earhart, Rudyard. Kipling, Groucho Marx, Salvador Dali, Bob Marley, Beyoncé, Ariana Grande, and Eric Clapton.

Dog (1922 - 1934 - 1946 - 1958 - 1970 - 1982 - 1994 - 2006 - 2018 - 2030)

Dogs are loyal, honest, and faithful, but plagued by worry, a sharp tongue, and a tendency to be a fault finder. Dogs make excellent businesspeople, activists, and teachers. Some dogs: Socrates, Alexander Calder, Winston Churchill, Benjamin Franklin, George Gershwin, Jane Goodall, Mother Teresa, Golda Meir, Steven Spielberg, Michael Jackson, and Donald Trump.

Pig/Boar (1923 - 1935 - 1947 - 1959 - 1971 - 1983 - 1995 - 2007 - 2019 - 2031)


Boars are splendid intellectual, sincere, tolerant, and honest companions. In expecting others to reciprocate, boars are incredibly naïve, and their quest for material goods could be their downfall.
